The **Office of Research, Innovation, and Economic Impact** is inviting applications to participate in a 2-day interactive workshop focused on building the partnerships needed to *Translate Grand Challenge Research into Real-World Impact*. The workshop will be held in person on **October 22 and 23**.

Led by the [Saath Partners](#), this workshop is designed to strengthen the ability of faculty to create impact through their research. Participants will gain practical concepts, tools, and peer-learning opportunities needed to strategically identify impactful partners, successfully initiate and sustain partnerships, and productively manage those partnerships. Through facilitated group discussions and applied exercises, faculty will have the opportunity to use these concepts and tools to further develop their own partnership strategies to support research translation.

This workshop is being offered in support of the Grand Challenge Initiative (GCI). Faculty leading or participating in currently funded GCI teams will have the opportunity to hone their partnership strategies and strengthen their tactics for securing partners. Faculty interested in submitting future GCI proposals will gain the practical knowledge and frameworks needed to present strong partnership development strategies in their upcoming proposals. However, all faculty interested in developing partnerships to translate their research into impact are encouraged to apply!

What You'll Gain:

- **A shared language and research-informed foundation** for understanding how effective partnerships support research translation and real-world impact.
- **Practical tools and frameworks** for identifying, initiating, designing, and sustaining productive cross-sector and interdisciplinary partnerships.
- **Strategies for articulating the relevance and value of your research** to diverse stakeholders and cultivating partnerships that can strengthen impact, visibility, and future opportunities for support.

- **A partnership - building roadmap** that can inform a future GCI proposal , strengthen the implementation of a funded GCI project , or advance other transdisciplinary research efforts .

Who should apply!

- Faculty leading or participating in funded GCI teams
- Faculty who are in the process of preparing a GCI proposal or interested in preparing a future GCI proposal.
- Faculty interested in building transdisciplinary partnerships to support the translation of their research into impact.

Space is limited. PI-eligible faculty (as defined by [University Policy 4012](#)) and participants willing to commit to participation in both workshop days will receive priority. **Applications must be submitted by 5 PM on Wednesday, Sept. 16, 2026, via this [application link](#).**
